



# 26) WRISTLET KNIT  
using Knitting Machine

Yarn: 3 oz. acrylic worsted, please consult the color chart for colors.

Mitt should fit snug, but not binding.

Try it on a man.

Gauge: 5 sts, 7 rows = 1"

Tension: approximately 5

CO 40 sts with WY and ravel cord, ending COR. Change to MC E-wrap CO over working needles and thread carriage. RC 000. K even to RC 48. T 9. K 1 row. Relatch ribbing either K 1, P 1 or K 2, P 2 as desired. It's usually easier to convert to ribbing after every 20 rows., rather than knitting the entire length and then converting, but this is your preference.

Latch off, pulling 2<sup>nd</sup> stitch through first, 3<sup>rd</sup> through 2<sup>nd</sup> etc.  
Pull yarn tail through last st to fasten off.

Finishing: Using safety pins, match V st together along the long edge, approx. 10".

Weave up about 5 1/2". Thread yarn through one side for 1 1/2" (thumb opening), close remaining. Repeat for second mitt.

If you can make a thumb, once the mitt is sewn, pick up 22, 24 or 26 sts w/dp needles around the opening. The number depends on the size of the opening, work K 1, P 1 for 8 or 9 rows, bind off.

Before you attach the logo PLEASE write a short note to the service person, with your name & address on back. Using tapestry needle, **secure between the two mitts 2" from an edge to insure it is not torn off.**
